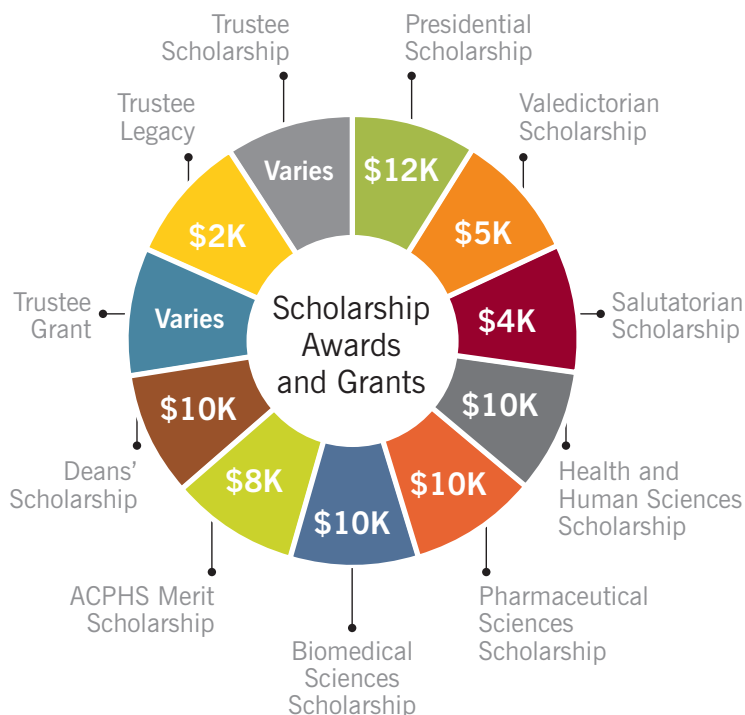




Institutional Aid



Academic Eligibility for Merit Awards

- **Presidential Scholarship**
GPA ≥ 95% (3.8 – 4.0);
SAT ≥ 1240 (≥ 620 on CR & M); ACT ≥ 29
 - **Dean's Scholarship**
GPA ≥ 90% (3.6±);
SAT ≥ 1200 (≥ 600 on CR & M); ACT ≥ 27
 - **ACPHS Merit Scholarship**
GPA ≥ 85%; SAT ≥ 1160 (≥ 580 on CR & M);
ACT ≥ 25
 - **Valedictorian Scholarship**
SAT ≥ 1100 (≥ 550 on CR & M); ACT ≥ 24
Ranked first in graduating class
 - **Salutatorian Scholarship**
SAT ≥ 1100 (≥ 550 on CR & M); ACT ≥ 24
Ranked second in graduating class
- a. All merit scholarships are mutually exclusive. The highest level scholarship for which the student is determined eligible supersedes all others.
 - b. SAT and ACT examinations must be taken prior to February 1, 2012 for merit scholarship consideration.
 - c. Valedictorian and Salutatorian Scholarships will be awarded in addition to merit scholarships.
 - d. Strength of high school curriculum (AP, IB, Honors and College coursework) is considered in the admission decision and scholarship selection.
 - e. Merit scholarships are available only to first-time, first-year students entering college.
 - f. Trustee Legacy is awarded to new students with a sibling currently enrolled at ACPHS.

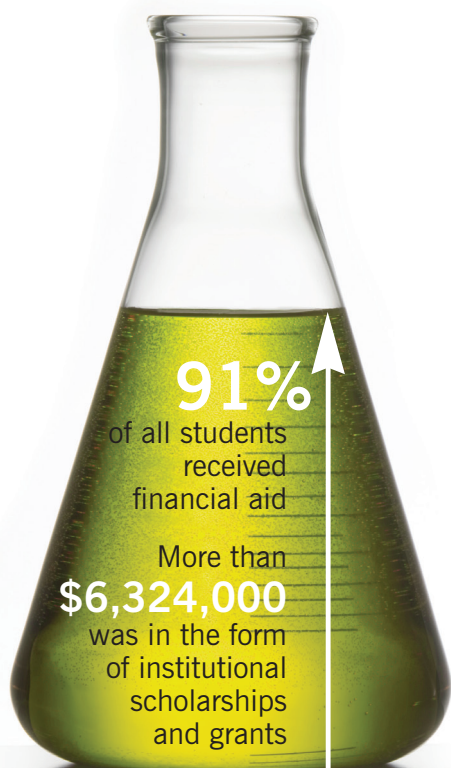

Federal Aid

Institutional Scholarships and Grants

Awards are based upon full-time enrollment each semester, unless otherwise indicated. Need-based scholarships require the student to file the FAFSA each year by the published priority deadlines. A list of institutional scholarships and grants is available at www.acphs.edu.

Federal Direct Loan Programs

Stafford Loans (subsidized or unsubsidized), Parent Loans for Undergraduate Students (PLUS), Health Professions Student Loans (HPSL), and Perkins Loans. A complete list of federal loans are available at www.acphs.edu.

Work Study

Work study positions are also available on campus and at approved off-campus sites. Students working in positions on-campus are paid hourly and typically work three to six hours per week during the academic year.
