## 2 + 2 PROGRAM

Earn your associate's degree in Public Health from Dutchess Community College (DCC) and your bachelor's degree in **Public Health** from ACPHS in four years. The future of health science is yours to change.

### HOW TO APPLY:

- Be enrolled in the Public Health A.S. degree at DCC.
- Submit a transfer application to ACPHS by May 1 prior to the desired fall starting semester at ACPHS (typically during the 2nd year at DCC).
- Your application fee to ACPHS will be waived if applying through the 2+2 program.

### HOW IT WORKS:

- You will attend DCC for the first two years of the program, pursuing your associate's degree.
- You will attend ACPHS for the remaining two years of the program, completing the requirements for your bachelor's degree in Public Health.
- Students will matriculate at ACPHS once the following have occurred:
  - Completion of the associate's degree in Science by the start of the semester in which they enroll at ACPHS.
  - Completion of an overall and science GPA of 3.0 or greater from DCC.
- Students typically complete both the associate's degree and bachelor's degree requirements in four years.
