



Post Graduate Placement and Education 2015 to 2017 for ALL Graduates

The responses were gathered in a survey. In 2015, employment data were collected in November from a survey for graduates of 2015. In 2016 and 2017, employment data/plans were collected in February from a survey for future graduates of 2016 and 2017, respectively. Since the data for 2016 and 2017 were collected before graduation, the confirmed residency numbers are likely an underestimate. This data is for ALL graduates followed by data on selected degree programs.
