## RIGHTS OF THE REPORTING INDIVIDUAL

- To know your Title IX rights, which include access to all available resources (i.e. counseling, medical services, legal/advocacy & support).
- To be notified of your options to press/file criminal charges
- To be notified of your options for reporting assault through an administrative / on-campus investigation.
- To be notified of your options to avoid contact with the alleged perpetrator.
- To change your academic or living situations.
- Access to free medical treatment.
- Access free counseling and advocacy services.
- To be protected against retaliatory harassment.
- To be informed of how to report any subsequent problems.
- To request an escort to ensure you can move safely between classes and activities.
- To request academic accommodations to ensure that you do not have to attend the same class as the accused perpetrator.
- To receive academic support services, such as tutoring.
- To request to re-take a course or withdraw from a class without penalty.
- To review any disciplinary action taken against you to see if there is a causal connection between the harassment and misconduct that may have resulted in you being disciplined.
